Thanks to the Wabun Chiefs and administration staff, the vision to create and develop Wabun Sun has documented and promoted the development of the Wabun Tribal Council, Wabun Health Services and the Wabun First Nation communities of Beaverhouse, Brunswick House, Chapleau Ojibwe, Flying Post, Matachewan, Mattagami and Wahgoshig.

The Wabun Chiefs and Wabun executive was ahead of its time when it created Wabun Sun with the assistance of Xavier Kataquapit and Michael McGrath as editors and

writers. Ten years ago, few First Nations organizations or agencies produced their own newspapers. Today we see many.

Wabun Sun is proud to have produced stories that have featured and highlighted major resource development projects with the non-Native private sector, as well as community stories documenting and promoting initiatives in all of Wabun's First Nations over the past decade. It is good to know that for the rest of time, there will be documented positive stories on the individual Chiefs, Wabun Tribal Council and Wabun Health Services leadership and staff members and Wabun community members. These stories featured detailed interviews and were professionally written to provide informative articles.

Wabun Sun has served to keep Wabun First Nation members informed as to development and decision

making and in addition it has provided Wabun Chiefs, Councils and administrations a means to stay in touch with Wabun First Nation members, staff, First Nation government, agencies and organizations as well as non-Native government, agencies and organizations.

Through the development of historical stories for Wabun Sun, there are now documented accounts and interviews that promote the history of Wabun First Nations. Ten years of producing Wabun Sun through many stories and photos have provided Wabun First Nations with a rich and detailed historical database that can and will be referred to into the future.

"Thanks to our Chiefs, Wabun Tribal Council had the vision to develop and produce Wabun Sun. The mainstream media is often negative in its approach to coverage concerning First Nations and Wabun Sun has played a key role in





- Historic Process On Self Governance Will Determine Future: The Nishnawbe-Aski Nation Self Governance Negotiation Committee held its first ever off-reserve public meeting at the Timmins Native Friendship Centre January 23, 2002. The information and public consultation meeting drew more than 100 people. The NAN Committee was joined by government of Canada negotiators to explain the process of self governance.

- Elder Theresa Memegoes Provides History Of Chapleau Ojibwe FN: This community is home to First Nation descendants who have lived in the area for many generations. Elder Theresa Memegoes provided a history of the her community, which was established along the former Highway 129.
